A Message to our Conference Participants: Soroptimist International of Las Cruces is part of a volunteer network of 80,000 members in 130 countries. We work locally, nationally and internationally to educate and empower women and girls. Each year SI groups around the world implement nearly 4000 projects to help women and girls attain education, develop leadership skills and lead successful, productive lives. These projects have included equipping women's clinics in Papua New Guinea; providing solar lamps to schools in Uganda so that girls can study in the evenings; awarding *Live Your Dream Scholarships* to women in the Americas, helping them complete their educations and secure higher standards of living; providing resources for immigrant women fleeing domestic violence; and funding micro-enterprise artisan projects for low-income women.

Since it was chartered in July 1970, Soroptimist International of Las Cruces has provided some 900 member years of service and donated more than \$500,000 to support girls and women in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County. To raise money for our projects, we sponsor the Turkey Trot every year on the Saturday before Thanksgiving.
